

## Global Women's Peace Network 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Women's Leadership Conference

## Transforming our World through Advancing Peace: a Culture of Peace and Human Dignity

November, 3-5, 2023 Venue: Radisson Blu, Larnaca, Cyprus

One hundred and ten women from thirty eight nations, representing governments, international institutions and civil society met in the historical Mediterranean city of Larnaca / Cyprus to strengthen their solidarity and call to action under the theme, "Transforming our World through Advancing Peace: A Culture of Peace and Human Dignity".

At the opening dinner, next to WFWPI's international President Ms. Moriko Hori, we had the pleasure of the presence of HE. Mrs. Philippa Karsera First Lady of Cyprus, Hon. Stephie Drakos, Former minister of justice and Public Order together with her husband, and Ms. Marilyn Theodoulou, Office of Commission of Gender Equality, Cyprus.

Ms Mitty Tohma, WFWP - Vice President of Europe gave the opening remarks! She highlighted the need for a call for peace among an ever rising number of conflicts connected to violence and war. Ms. Tohma expresses her hope that this gathering of women in an atmosphere of friendliness and cooperation can have an impact on a wider level. Mrs. Moriko Hori, President of WFWP International & WFWP-Japan: Mrs. Hori just had arrived from Ruanda, where WFWP Japan founded and is sustaining an educational centre since 25 yrs. Over 3000 children passed through this school. Mrs. Hori also describes examples of absolute poverty, that brought tears to most of the participants eyes, and made us realize once more the importance to meet and together bring a change into this world!
